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#### **Cutting Instructions:**

Fabric A: Flowers - Blue

 See instructions to cut one of each Bicycle Frame, front fender, back fender, long handle bar and short handle bar.

Fabric B: Strawberries - Pink

See instructions to cut sixteen petals.

Fabric C: Yellow

• See instructions to cut two handles and two covers

Fabric D: Salmon

See instructions to cut one seat and two pedals.

Fabric E: Black

See instructions to cut two tires.

Fabric F: White

• Cut one 34 ½" x 23 ½" rectangle.

Fabric G: Green

- Cut two 1 ½" x 36 ½" strips.
- Cut two 1 ½" x 23 ½" strips.
- Cut five 2 ½" x width of fabric (WOF) strips for the binding.
- See instructions to cut one pedal frame.

Fabric H: Bicycles – Multi

- Cut two 5  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 36  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips from length of fabric (LOF).
- Cut two 5  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 25  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips from WOF.

Fabric I: Flowers - White

 $\bullet$  Cut one 5 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strips into four 5 ½" squares.

Backing: Houses – Multi

• Cut one 43" x 54" piece for the backing.

### You will you also need:

Fusible Web



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#### **Block Assembly:**

- 1. Enlarge Templates 400%.
- 2. Following the manufacturer's instructions to trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about 1/8" outside the drawn lines. Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.
- 3. Refer to the quilt photo and Figure 1 to arrange and press the bicycle parts onto the  $34 \frac{1}{2}$ " x  $23\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip.



4. Finish the raw edges of each shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to make the center panel.





Fig. 2





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

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### Quilt Assembly - Refer to Figure 2 while assembling the quilt top:

- 5. Sew one 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 23  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip to each side of center panel. Sew one 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 36  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip to the top and bottom of the center panel.
- 6. Sew one  $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " x  $25 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to each side of the center panel.
- 7. Sew one 5  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I square to each of the two 5  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 36  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strips to make the top and bottom borders. Sew the borders to the top and bottom of the center panel to complete the quilt top.
- 8. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 9. Sew the five 2 ½" x WOF Fabric G strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half, lengthwise with wrong sides together, and press.
- 10. Bind as desired.
