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Estimates for yardage assume long border strips are pieced. Additional fabric needed for strips cut on the lengthwise grain. All strips are cut across the width of the fabric unless noted (*) otherwise. Seam allowances of ¼" are included in all measurements. Starching your fabrics will make bias cut edges resist stretching. Blocks should finish 11" square.


O Block Unit Cutting and Construction


For each one you will need 4 Unit A and 4 Unit B and one 3 ½" center square.

Unit B is based on the sew and flip method of piecing.

- Start with 4 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares of the 'O' fabric, and from the background fabric cut 4 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares and 4 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.
- Mark the wrong side of the white squares diagonally with light pencil, this will be your stitching line.
- Place one large background square face down on the right side of the 'O' fabric square. Stitch on the marked line, press the triangle open, then trim off the extra fabric from the back.
- Repeat the same process on the opposite corner with the small squares. These are your Unit B.

UNIT B CONSTRUCTION















Unit A is constructed of rectangles. One is background and one of the 'O' fabric they each measure 2 ½" X 3 ½". You will need 4 Unit A.

Assembly Diagram



X Block Cutting and Construction

For each one you will need 2 Unit A and 2 Unit B. Strips for the Xs are longer than necessary and will be trimmed to square up the block.


- From the white background fabric: For each block cut one 8¼" square and cut diagonally twice.
 From the X fabric: Cut four 3 3/8" X 7" rectangles, and one 3 3/8" square.



UGS & KISSES"

- From the white background fabric: For each block cut one 8½" square and cut diagonally twice.
 From the X fabric: Cut four 3 3/8" X 7" rectangles, and one 3 3/8" square.

UNIT A CONSTRUCTION



- Start with 4 quarter square triangles and two 3 3/8" X 7" rectangles. Sew together as pictured making two Unit A. Join the 3 3/8" square with two more 3 3/8" X 7" rectangles, this is the Unit B.
- Assemble the units as pictured, trim strip edges, your block should be 11 1/2" trimmed.


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Quilt Assembly

- Using a design wall arrange blocks in a manner that pleases you!
- · Sew blocks into rows, then join the rows.
- Measure down the length of the top. Make 2 border strips to that length and sew to the sides of your top.
- Repeat the step above for the top and bottom borders.
- · Quilt as desired!

It's a quilt that will remind your loved one of you every time they snuggle it!
