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## Fabric Requirements:

37395-11 Blue	1 Fat quarter	37395-09 Grass	2 Fat quarters
37395-1 Burgundy	1 Fat quarter	37395-12 Purple	2 Fat quarters
37395-8 Forrest	1 Fat quarter	37395-2 Red	2 Fat quarters
37395-4 Rose	1 Fat quarter	37395-3 Cranberry	2 Fat quarters
37395-7 Yellow	1 Fat quarter	37395-5 Burnt Orange	2 Fat quarters
37395-13 Violet	1 Fat quarter	37395-10 Navy	3 Fat quarters

37395-16 Tan 4 yards

Background: 37395-19 Charcoal 3 yards (includes binding)

Backing: 42/3 yards



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### **BLOCK INSTRUCTIONS:**



You will be making the same block as diagrammed above, in 4 color combinations. Seen below.

Color A: 37395-9 Color B: 37395-1 Color C: 37395-11 BG color 37395-16

Make 6 Blocks

Color A: 37395-12 Color B: 37395-4 Color C: 37395-8 BG color 37395-16

Make 5 Blocks

Color A: 37395-2 Color B: 37395-13 Color C: 37395-7 BG color 37395-16

Make 6 Blocks

Color A: 37395-10 Color B: 37395-3 Color C: 37395-5 BG color 37395-16

Make 3 Blocks

# **Cutting Instructions:**

For each individual block, cut:

- (8) 4" squares from background fabric (tan)
- (2) 4" squares from fabric color B
- (2) 4" squares from fabric color C
- (4) 4" squares from fabric A

**SPECIAL NOTE:** Make sure to multiply the above cutting instructions for the number of blocks you need to make in each case.


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


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
# Sewing instructions:

1. This block is made entirely of half-square triangles. Layer each color square on top of a background color square and sew together using the method outlined below, to make your half-square triangles.





- 2. Trim your squares to 3.5".
- 3. Construct your blocks according to the diagram below.



4. Trim all blocks to 12.5" square. Set all 20 blocks aside.



# Cutting Instructions for LARGE half-square triangle block:

1. Cut - (8) 7 3/8" squares from background fabric (tan)

- (2) 7 3/8" squares from fabric color, 37395-3

- (2) 7 3/8" squares from fabric color, 37395-5


- (4) 7 3/8" squares from fabric, 37395-10

- 2. Sew your half-square triangle unit as in previous steps.
- 3. Trim each half-square triangle unit to 6.5".
- 4. Assemble half-square triangle block the same as previous blocks. Trim final block to 24.5". Set aside.


## Cutting instructions border and background:

- 1. From Charcoal, 37395-19, cut (4) 12.5" squares. Set aside.
- 2. Cut two isoceles triangles, with two same sides 24.5" and the long side 34".

\*\*\*NOTE: Pay attention to the direction of the fabric. One triangle should be cut on grain and one on bias, so that the moire pattern lines up the same way.



3. Cut one isoceles triangle with two sides 16.5 " and the long side 24.5". Again, pay attention to the grain of the fabric. See below.



4. From Charcoal, cut (7) 2.5 inch strips from WOF. Set aside.

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#### Quilt construction:

1. Gather all 20 completed 12.5" half-square triangle blocks and the four 12.5" charcoal squares. Assemble them in rows following the picture on the cover.


In other words, you will have:

2 rows of 5 blocks---all colorful
1 row of 4 colorful blocks with one charcoal
1 row of 3 colorful blocks with one charcoal
1 row of two colorful blocks and one charcoal
1 row with a single colorful block and one charcoal

- 2. Next sew these 6 rows together as in the photo on the cover. Don't worry that they don't line up on the right.
- 3. Now, trim off half of the charcoal squares by turning the piece on a 45 degree angle counterclockwise and cutting straight down the right side----MAKE SURE TO LEAVE AT LEAST 1/4" for seam allowance.

Set aside.

4. Gather the large half-square triangle block and the three large isoceles triangles. We will now construct the part of the quilt seen below.





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#### Quilt construction:

You should have two pieces that look like below. Sew the two pieces together along the long diagonal.



Take your 2.5" strips and sew strips together for your border. Sew borders around the quilt.

Quilt and bind using your preferred method.
