



Constructing Quarter Blocks

1. Refer to block diagram, arrange and sew pieces to make a total of (4) quarter blocks using fabrics **A**, **B** and **E**.







Make 4

Sew together E and D pieces. Sew together C and B pieces. Sew together the sewn unit. Add (2) A pieces to the sides of sewn unit to complete 1 quarter block. Repeat to make (4) Quarter Blocks.

Constructing Half Blocks

1. Refer to block diagram, arrange and sew pieces to make a total of (4) half blocks using fabrics **A, B** and **E**.


Sew together E and D pieces. Sew B and C pieces together. Repeat to make (2) ED and (2) BC units. Sew together the ED and BC units and add to the sides of the A piece. Add F and G pieces on the sides of sewn unit to complete 1 Quarter Block.


2. Repeat to make a total of (4) blocks in fabric combination C,B,E and (2) blocks in fabric combination D,B,E



Constructing whole blocks

Refer to block diagram, arrange and sew pieces to make a total of (8) whole blocks using fabrics **D**, **B** and **E** by make 2 sections denoted by the red line.





Sew together **D** and **E** pieces. Sew together **C** and **B** pieces. Sew together the **DE** and **BC** units to make (1) subunit. Make a total of (4) subunits. Sew (2) subunits and (2) A pieces together to make 2

sections, as shown. Sew sections together to complete 1 block.


Repeat to make a total number of (4) blocks in the fabric combinations **C**, **B**, **E** and (6) blocks in the fabric combinations **F**, **B**, **E**. Square to 9 1/2".

Quilt Top Assembly

1. Quilt Center. Refer to the Quilt Center diagram on the next page. Sew together diagonal rows starting from the top left. Since the layout is on-point, quilt center should measure approximately 38 3/4" x 51 1/2" raw edge to raw edge.

2. Outer border. Sew (2) 3 $1/2" \times 51 1/2"$ **C** strips to the opposite long sides of quilt center, followed by (2) 3 $1/2" \times 44 3/4"$ **C** strips to the remaining opposite short sides.



Quilting Instructions:

With the backing fabric laying taut, place batting and then quilt top to form quilt sandwich. Baste sandwich. Quilt as desired. Bind with 2 1/2" **B** strips to finish quilt.
