

This lightweight "rag" quilt is so easy and fun to make. There's no batting, no basting, and no quilting. Your washer and dryer do all the work. Suitable for flannel as it keeps the large quilt from becoming too heavy.


KEY	FABRIC	SKU	YD	CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS
		43033-4 red	2	(42) 7" x 7" squares 350" of bias binding cut 2 1/4" wide
		43032-4 red	1 1/2	(42) 7" x 7" squares
		43034-4 red	1 1/4	(31) 7" x 7" squares
		43035-4 red	1 1/4	(33) 7" x 7" squares
		43035-8 wht/red	1 1/4	(32) 7" x 7" squares _.

5 1/3 yard for Backing (Optional as this pattern does not require backing)

Assembly:

1. Sort the squares cut from each pattern into 12 columns of 15 stacks (rows) each. Refer to the quilt diagram and the yardage cutting chart. Place the first square face down and place the next square in your row on top face up. Sew together using a 1/2" seam. The raw edges will be on top (right side). Continue adding squares from the stack to complete the row.

Join all the 15 stacks into rows following the same method.



- 2. Matching ends and seams, join the rows in the same manner wrong sides together, with a 1/2" seam. All raw edges will be on the right side of the fabric.
- 3. Join the binding strips together and bind the edges of the quilt.
- 4. With small sharp scissors or a clipper especially made for rag quilts, snip the raw edges at 1/4" intervals. Clip close to the stitching, but don't cut through it. If you accidentally snip the seam, go back to the sewing machine and reinforce the spot.
- 5. Rinse the quilt in cold water in the washing machine on the delicate cycle.
- 6. Dry the quilt with low heat in the dryer. Empty the lint trap frequently. Fluff the 'rag' edges if necessary.



Options:

A Little Extra Weight

The previous instructions makes a lightweight quilt top which is suitable for the flannel fabric. If you prefer something a little more substantial, you can add batting and backing and quilt using a stitch that will be centered in each block but not touching the seam allowance. Bind and proceed following the instructions from step #4 on previous page.
