

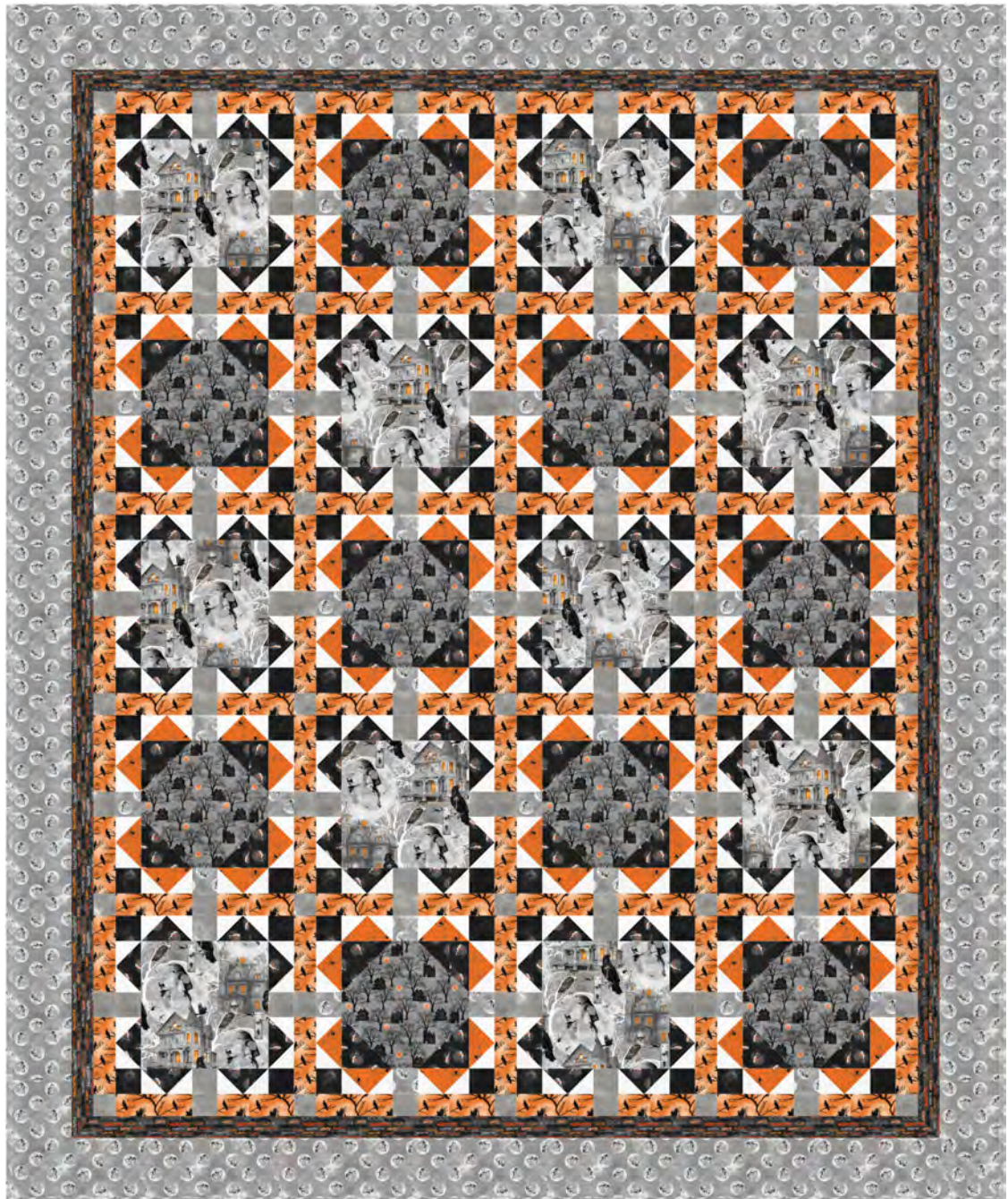



**NOTE:** This pattern uses the Quilt In A Day Flying Geese ruler (Mini Geese Ruler Set #2020). Instructions are give for both the No-Waste method and the ruler method.

When cutting your fabric, if you are using the ruler, cut the **RED** instructions. If you are using the No-Waste method, cut the **BLUE** instructions.

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## 1/4" Seam Allowance Check

Even if you use a 1/4" foot, your seam allowance may not be accurate!

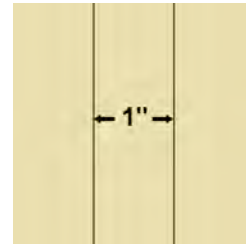
To check if your seam is accurate, cut three 1 1/2" x 3" pieces from scrap fabric.

Sew the pieces together along the 3" side, using what you believe is a 1/4" seam.

Press away from the center piece.

Measure.

The center piece should be exactly 1" wide.



If, when you measure, the center is less than 1", your seam allowance is too large.

If it's more than 1", your seam allowance is too small.

Refer to your machine owner's manual for instructions on changing your needle position.

Repeat the test until your center strip measures exactly 1".

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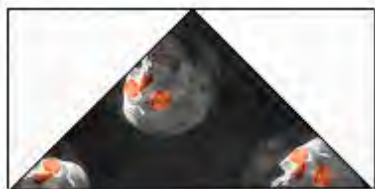
## Block A:

Make 10

1. Use the Quilt In A Day ruler to make eighty 1 1/2" x 3" flying geese units using the fabric B 6" squares and fabric D 4 1/2" squares. OR Use the technique sheet on page 5 and the fabric B 2 3/8" squares and fabric D 4 1/4" squares. Trim to 2" x 3 1/2". Make 80 units.

2. Combine the geese units with one fabric E 8" square, four fabric A 2" squares and four fabric C 2" squares to complete the block. Square to 11". Make 10 blocks.

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## Block B:

Make 10

- Use the ruler to make eighty  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3" flying geese units using the fabric B 6" squares and fabric G  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. OR Use the technique sheet on page and the fabric B  $2\frac{3}{8}$ " squares and fabric G  $4\frac{1}{4}$ " squares. Trim to 2" x  $3\frac{1}{2}$ ". Make 80 units.
- Use the technique sheet on page 5 to make Quick Corners on the fabric H 8" squares using the fabric D  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.
- Combine the geese units with the unit from step 4, four fabric A 2" squares and four fabric F 2" squares to complete the block. Square to 11". Make 10 blocks.

## Assembly:

- Combine one fabric F 2" x WOF and two fabric I 5" x WOF strips as shown to make a stripset. Make three stripsets and cut into (49)  $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x 11" sashing units.



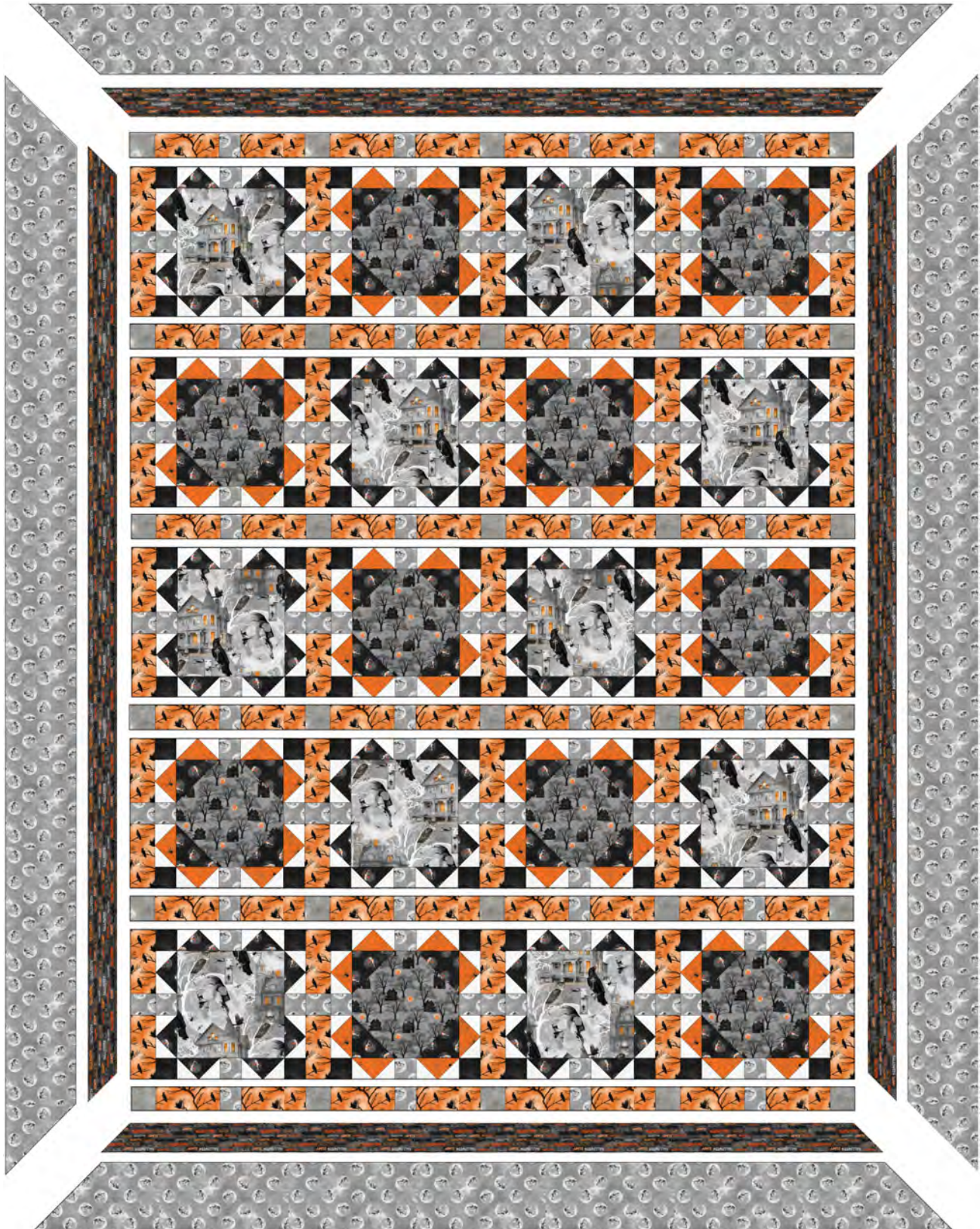
- Use the assembly diagram on page 4 to combine the blocks and sashing units with the fabric C  $2\frac{1}{4}$ " squares.
- Cut one fabric J  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip in half. Add a whole strip to each piece. Add to the top and bottom of the quilt, preparing to miter corners.
- Stitch four fabric J  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips together in pairs. Add to the left and right sides of the quilt, mitering corners.
- Stitch eight fabric F  $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips together in pairs. Add to the quilt, mitering corners.





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## Assembly Diagram



### Finishing:

11. Layer, baste and quilt as desired.
12. Bind with eight fabric F 2½" x WOF strips.

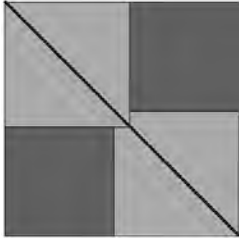


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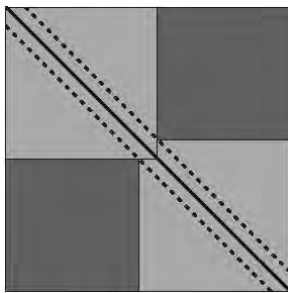
## No-Waste Flying Geese

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the smaller squares.

Add two smaller squares to one larger square, right sides together, as shown.



Stitch a 1/4" seam on each side of the drawn line.

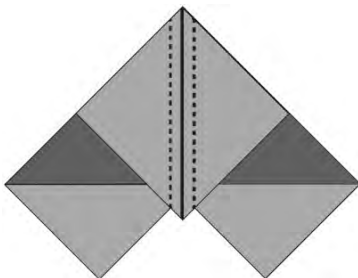


Cut on the drawn line and press small triangles outward.



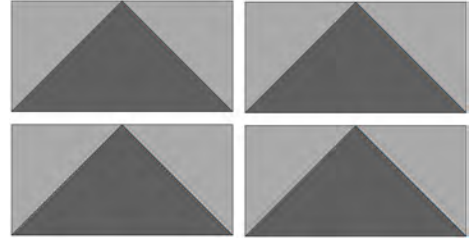
Add one small square, right sides together, as shown.

Stitch a 1/4" seam on each side of the drawn line.



Cut on the drawn line and press small triangles outward. Trim to the size indicated in the pattern.

Each set of one large square and four small squares makes four flying geese units.



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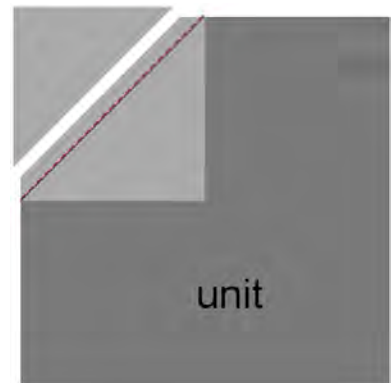
## Quick Corners

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the small squares (black line).

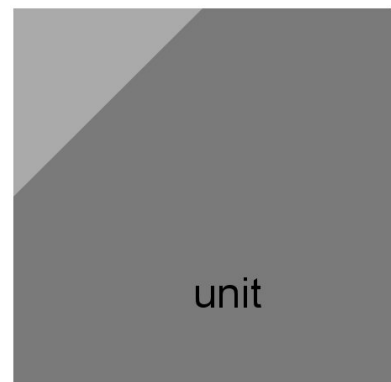
Layer one square, right sides together, on top of the unit.

Stitch on the drawn line (red line).

Cut away excess, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance.



Press triangle outward.



Repeat as instructed/shown in pattern.
