WINDHAM FABRICS

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Fabric requirements:

- 1 - 2 ½ Strip Kit (2 strips of 20 different fabrics)
- 2 ¼ Yards Floral Multi 37347-X (Borders, Binding, 2 strips)
- 3 ½ yards fabric of your choice for backing

Cutting Instructions:

From the strip sets sub cut as follows:



- 37348-1 Cream
(8) Eight 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips
(8) Eight 2 ½" x 2 ½" squares



- 37348-2 Tan
(4) Four 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips



- 37348-3 Dusty Aqua
(8) Eight 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips



- 37349-4 Burgundy
(8) Eight 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips



- 37349-6 Breen
(8) Eight 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips



- 37350-1 Cream
(4) Four 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips



- 37350-2 Tan
(8) Eight 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips



- 37350-5 Green
(8) Eight 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips



- 37351-1 Cream
(8) Eight 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips



- 37351-2 Tan
(8) Eight 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips
(4) Four 2 ½" x 2 ½" squares



- 37351-6 Breen
(8) Eight 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips



- 37352-4 Burgundy
(8) Eight 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips
(4) Four 2 ½" x 2 ½" squares



- 37352-5 Green
(4) Four 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips



- 37352-6 Breen
(8) Eight 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips



- 37353-1 Cream
(8) Eight 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips



- 37353-3 Dusty Aqua
(12) Twelve 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips



- 37353-5 Green
(4) Four 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips



- 37354-2 Tan
(8) Eight 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips
(1) One 2 ½" x 2 ½" square



- 37354-4 Burgundy
(8) Eight 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips



- 37354-5 Green
(8) Eight 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips



- From the Main Fabric 37347-Multi
Cut 2 Strips 2 ½" x WOF
Sub Cut (4) Four 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips
(4) Four 2 ½" x 2 ½" squares

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Layout:

This quilt will be constructed in quadrants.

Using **Diagram A** lay the pieces in place in stacks of 4.

Assembly:

Once you have them all laid out begin sewing each row together. Accuracy of $\frac{1}{4}$ " will ensure that your quilt will lay flat once assembled.

See **Diagram B** for the order of sewing the rows. Once you have all the rows sewn then begin the assembly of the unit.

Start in the lower right corner with the center square. There are more detailed assembly instructions and numbered rows on **Diagram B**.

Once you have assembled the rows together, you will need to trim the long edge of the triangle in a straight line. Make sure to leave $\frac{1}{4}$ in seam allowance along this edge.

You will now have 4 units that are shaped like triangles.

Assemble the 4 units into a square. Start with the first unit by adding the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square of 37354-2 Tan to the top right corner. **Add the remaining units in a clockwise direction. See Diagram C.**

Trimming/ Squaring Up the Center:

You have a row of 2" squares that are in the center of the quilt. Measure from the center of each 2" squares to the outside edge of the quilt. This should be approximately 20". Mark with chalk liner.

*NOTE Do not cut yet. If your measurements are not coming out at 20" adjust the measurement to find the average length. This will ensure that you achieve a square quilt. Now trim the edges.

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Borders

*Note This is a directional fabric.

Measure your quilt length on the left side, the right side and down the middle. Take the average of these numbers. This is the length that you will cut 2 strips 8 ½" x length of sides. You will be cutting on the LOF (Length of Fabric). Sew one strip on each side ensuring the direction of the fabric is correct.

Now measure the width of your quilt (with the borders on) across the top, the bottom and the center. Take the average of these numbers. This is the length you will need for your remaining two strips. Cut 3 strips 8 ½" by WOF (Width of Fabric). Sew these strips end to end and cut the length determined as the average. Attach to the top and the bottom of the quilt. Watch the direction of the fabric.

Quilting

Quilt and bind using your preferred method.

Binding:

Main Fabric 37347-Multi

Cut 6 strips 2 ½" x width of fabric. Sew end to end. Press in half length wise with wrong sides together. Attach to the front of the quilt. Turn and hand stitch down.

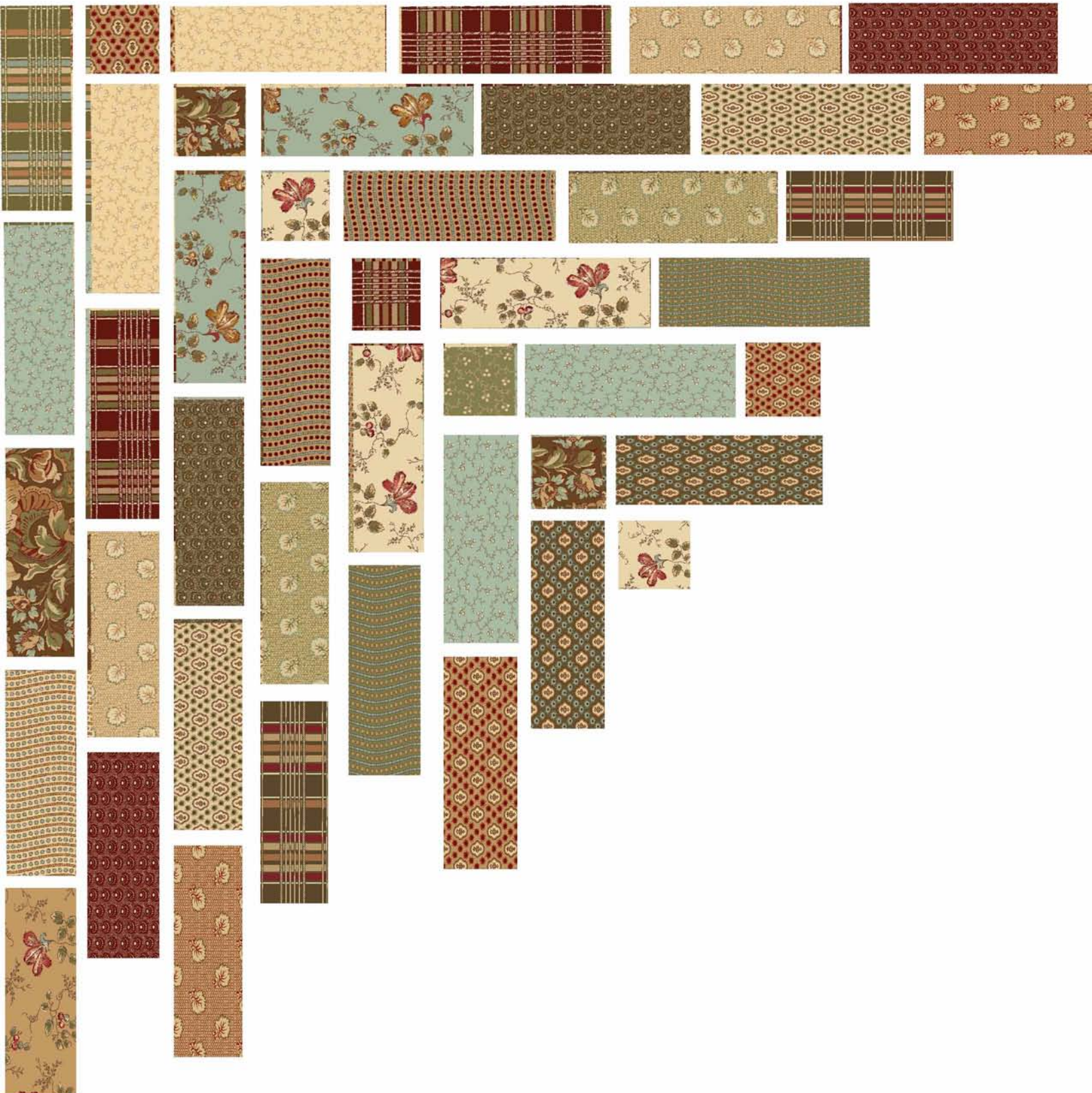
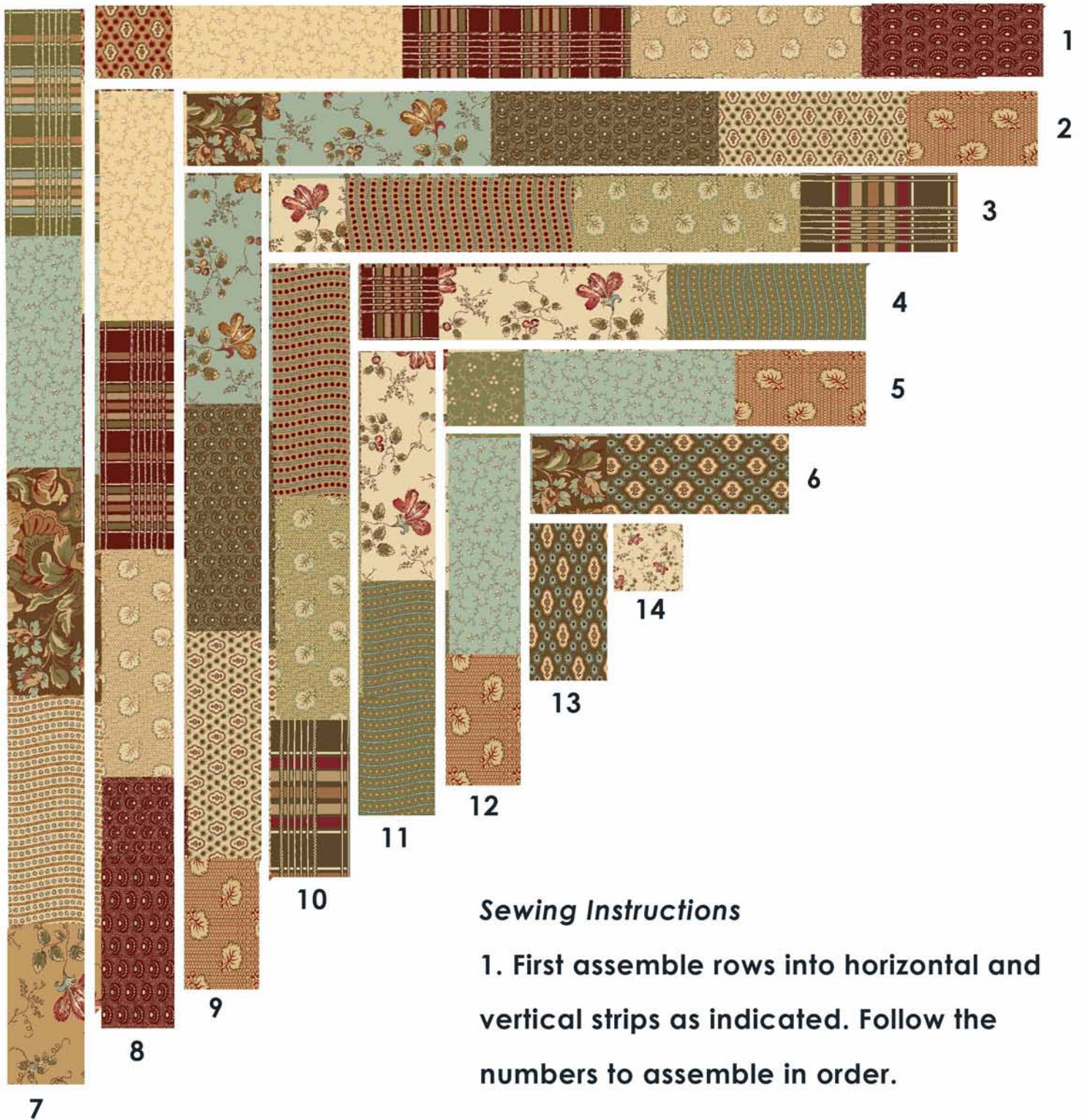


Diagram B Order for sewing rows together.



Sewing Instructions

1. First assemble rows into horizontal and vertical strips as indicated. Follow the numbers to assemble in order.
2. Now sew the rows together beginning with the cream center square (14) to the green strip (13), then proceeding in alternating rows: seam row #6, then row #12, then row #5 and so on.

Diagram C Sew all four Quadrants to the center square

****does not show the seam allowance**

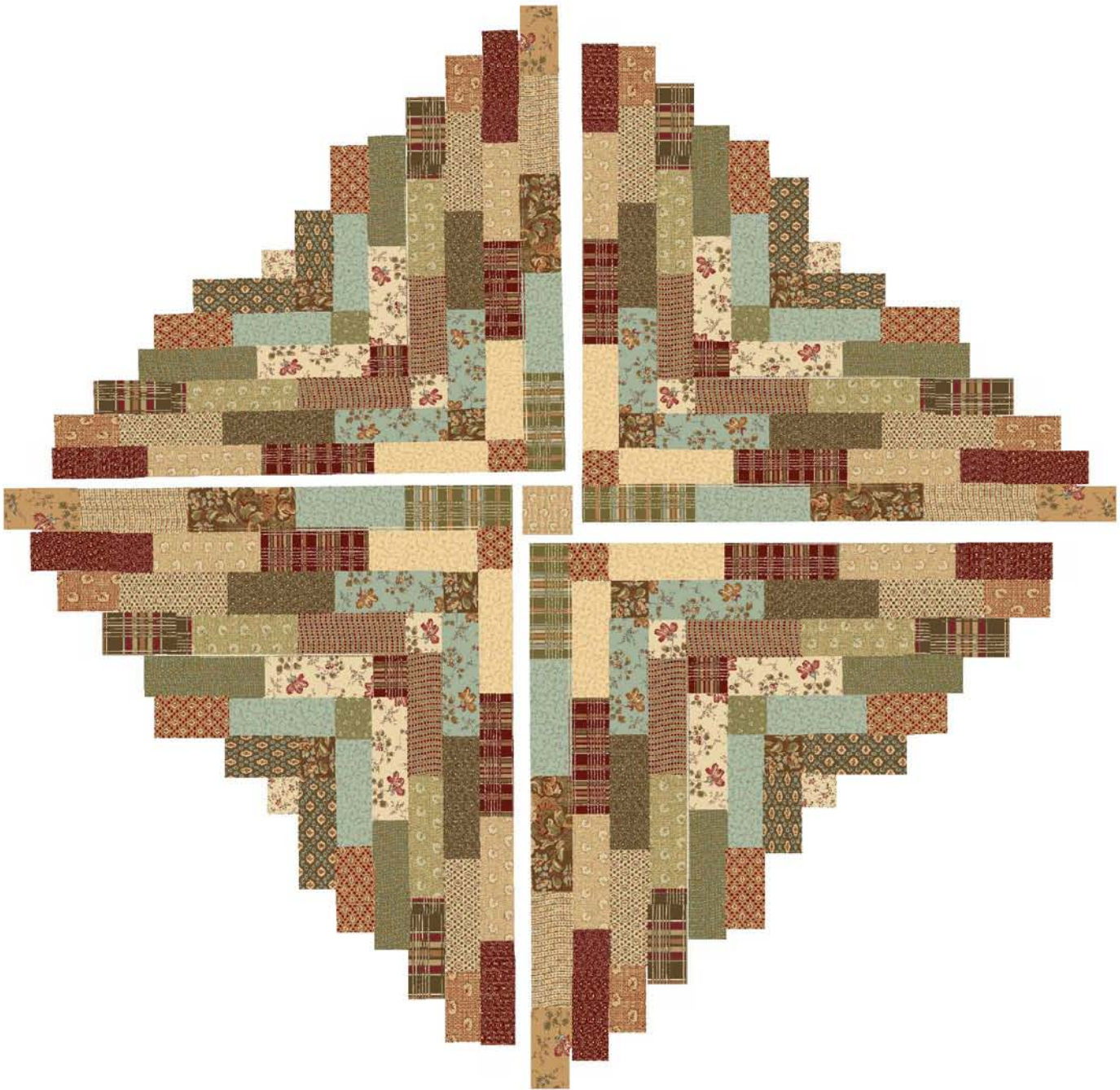

Once you have sewn all 4 quadrants together, measure out from the center square to make sure all 4 sides of the quilt are equidistant from the center and trim. Now you are ready to add your borders.
