Quilting & Binding

9. Layer the quilt top, batting and backing. Pin the layers together and quilt securely in place using your favorite method.

10. Cut 5 strips 2-1/4" x 42" from the solid blue and sew into a long row. Fold in half lengthwise and press on fold line. Pin and sew raw edges of binding to raw edges of top and quilt. Turn folded edge to back of quilt and stitch in place.

Fat Quarter of each of the following from the Storybook 6 Collection: 8 blues (SKU # 29193-1, 29194-1, 29195-1, 29197-1, 29201-1, 29202-1, 29203-1, 29204-1)
5 Yellows (SKU # 29195-4, 29198-4, 29200-4, 29202-4, 29205-4)

5 Yellows (SKU # 29195-4, 29198-4, 29200-4, 29202-4, 29205-4, 6 Reds (SKU # 29194-5, 29195-5, 29199-5, 29202-5, 29205-5, 29206-7 pink)

5/8 yd floral (SKU # 29204-5 Red) for setting triangles 3/4 yard solid periwinkle blue SKU # 25031 (inner border and binding) - fabric is from the Storybook 1930's Solids

2 yards backing

1 yard fusible interfacing

- 1. Transfer template markings to template material (card stock, freezer paper, etc) and cut out. Seam allowances are included in the templates.
- 2. Select 12 fabrics for the block centers and cut out one 6" x 7" rectangle of both fabric and fusible interfacing. Following manufacturer's directions, fuse the interfacing to the wrong side of the fabric rectangles.
- 3. Cut out 12 hexagons from these rectangles using Template A. Set aside.
- 4. Select pairs of fabrics with good contrast (ie, a red and a yellow, a yellow with a blue, etc) and from each pair, cut out 3 half hexagons of EACH fabric (Template B). (There is NO fusible interfacing on these patches.) You will need 12 sets of 6 half-hexagons.
- 5. Sew the sets of 6 half-hexagons together along the short ends, creating a hexagon ring with an opening in the center (Diagram 1).

6. Center and pin a coordinating fused hexagon to the center of each hexagon ring. Using a simple machine zig zag stitch, sew the center hexagon to the half-hexagon ring. Make 12 of these blocks (Diagram 2)

- 7. From the Floral (#29204-5) cut 24 triangles using Template C and 24 rectangles using Template Cr. **(You can cut both C and Cr from fabric that is folded with wrong sides together.)
- **Cr = C reversed)
- 8. Sew the C and Cr triangles to the Hexagon sides as shown in Diagram 3.

Repeat for all 12 Hexagon blocks.

9. Sew 3 blocks together into a horizontal row. Repeat for 3 more rows. Join the rows into the quilt center.

- 10. Cut 4 strips 2" x 42" from the blue solid fabric and trim each to fit the quilt sides for the inner border. Press seams toward the border strips.
- 11. Cut twenty assorted print rectangles 3" x 7-1/4" and join five along the short ends for a border row. Make 4 border rows.

12. Refer to the quilt picture and sew the border strips to the quilt sides, trimming the lengths if necessary.
