

Skill Level: Beginner Finished Size: 42" square Block Size: 7 1/2"

A darling quilt sure to please any little girl!

Materials List:

1/2 yd. #29911-6, cut eight 8" squares, centering the Sue block when cutting 1/4 yd. #29914-6, cut sixteen 3"squares (Block A); also cut five 2 1/4" (Binding Strips)

1/4 yd. #29920-6, cut twenty 3" squares (Block A)

1/4 yd. #29910-6, cut sixteen 3" squares (Block B)

1/4 yd. #29913-6, cut twenty 3" squares (Block B)

1/4 yd. #29916-6, cut four 1 1/2" x wof strips (Inner Border)

2/3 yd. #29912-3, cut four 4 1/2" x wof strips (Middle Border)

1/3 yd. #29915-6, cut five 1 1/2" x wof strips (Outer Border)

Fat quarters of #29921-1 red, #29915-1 red, #29914-5 green and #29922-6 blue prints (or scraps from the above fabrics) to fuse on Sue's bonnet and dress, if desired.

46" x 46" piece of backing fabric

46" x 46" piece of batting

Paper-backed fusible web

Block A

Referring to the diagram, sew four dark blue pieces together with five light blue pieces to form a nine patch. Repeat to make 4.



Block B

Referring to the diagram, sew four medium blue pieces together with five light blue pieces to form a nine patch. Repeat to make 4.



Dressing Sue

Using a light box or window, trace the bonnet and dress pieces from the back of the Sue block. Repeat eight times. Loosely cut out the images outside the drawn line. Fuse the dresses and bonnets to the wrong side of your fabrics and cut out on the line. Remove the paper backing and fuse in place to create colorful Sue blocks for your quilt. Use a zigzag or buttonhole stitch to secure the clothes. Embellish with embroidery, if desired.



Assembling the Quilt

- 1. Following the quilt layout diagram, Sew the Sue blocks with Blocks A and B to create four rows. Sew the rows together to create the quilt center.
- 2. Trim two #29916-6 border pieces to measure 28 1/2" and sew to each side of the quilt center. Trim the remaining two pieces to measure 30 1/2" and attach to the top and bottom.
- 3. Trim two #29912-3 yellow border strips to 32 1/2" and sew to the sides of the quilt. Trim the remaining two strips to 40 1/2" and attach to the top and bottom.
- 4. Trim two #29915-6 strips to measure 40 1/2" for the sides of the quilt and the final two to measure 42 1/2" for the top and bottom.
- 5. Layer the quilt top with batting and backing and quilt as desired.
- 6. Bind the quilt with the five 2 1/4" strips.

Skill Level: Beginner Finished Size: 42" square Block Size: 7 1/2"

A darling quilt sure to please any little girl!

Materials List:

1/2 yd. #29911-1, cut eight 8" squares, centering the Sue block when cutting

1/4 vd. #29914-1, cut sixteen 3"squares (Block A)

1/4 vd. #29910-1, cut sixteen 3" squares (Block A)

1 yd. #29913-1, cut four 3" squares (Block A); also cut four 4 1/2 x wof strips

(Middle Border and five 2 1/4" (Binding Strips)

1/4 yd. #29917-1, cut sixteen 3" squares (Block B)

1/4 yd. #29911-1, cut sixteen 3" squares (Block B)

1/6 yd. #29913-3, cut four 3" squares (Block B)

1/4 yd. #29922-3, cut four 1 1/2" x wof strips (Inner Border)

1/3 yd. #29919-1, cut five 1 1/2" x wof strips (Outer Border)

Fat quarters of #29910-6 blue, #29914-6 blue, #29914-5 green and #29917-1 red prints (or scraps from the above fabrics) to fuse on Sue's bonnet and dress, if desired.

46" x 46" piece of backing fabric

46" x 46" piece of batting

Paper-backed fusible web

Block A

Referring to the diagram, sew four red pieces together with four light pieces and one plaid center to form a nine patch. Repeat to make 4.



Block B

Referring to the diagram, sew four red pieces together with four light pieces and one plaid center to form a nine patch. Repeat to make 4.



Dressing Sue

Using a light box or window, trace the bonnet and dress pieces from the back of the Sue block. Repeat eight times. Loosely cut out the images outside the drawn line. Fuse the dresses and bonnets to the wrong side of your fabrics and cut out on the line. Remove the paper backing and fuse in place to create colorful Sue blocks for your quilt. Use a zigzag or buttonhole stitch to secure the clothes. Embellish with embroidery, if desired.



Assembling the Quilt

- 1. Following the quilt layout diagram, Sew the Sue blocks with Blocks A and B to create four rows. Sew the rows together to create the quilt center.
- 2. Trim two #29922-3 border pieces to measure $28\ 1/2$ " and sew to each side of the quilt center. Trim the remaining two pieces to measure $30\ 1/2$ " and attach to the top and bottom.
- 3. Trim two #29913-1 red border strips to 32 1/2" and sew to the sides of the quilt. Trim the remaining two strips to 40 1/2" and attach to the top and bottom.
- 4. Trim two #29919-1 strips to measure $40 \frac{1}{2}$ " for the sides of the quilt and the final two to measure $42 \frac{1}{2}$ " for the top and bottom.
- 5. Layer the quilt top with batting and backing and quilt as desired.
- 6. Bind the quilt with the five 2 1/4" strips.
